An Appreciation by "THE ORIENT"

In "THE ORIENT" for December 10th, 1919, appeared the following editorial appreciation of the AMERICAN CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR THE LEVANT.

All Americans in the Near East have a right to be well satisfied with the progress made by the American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant, and with the energy it has again been evincing since the armistice. Several years of activity have at length begun to bear fruit on both sides of the ocean. Firms in America have seen a vision of the possibilities of commerce between East and West, and have sent out quite a few representatives who have begun operations on a larger scale than ever for American trade. The plan suggested in this issue, of a Levant House to be established in New York, will certainly draw attention anew to the important possibilities in this direction; it will also serve as a centre for all persons already interested in the Near East, both in a business way and for social purposes. Those who spent any time in or near New York during the war remember with pleasure the gatherings from time to time in the "Constantinople" restaurant on 24th Street, with the good fellowship and the exchange of news that all valued so highly. Such a gathering place of a more official and pretentious sort will be much more attractive and valuable. When the American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant has established this Levant House, and the American Bank in Turkey and the direct line or lines of steamers from New York or other ports to Constantinople and Smyrna, then people will begin to realize what an immense amount of energy has been expended on the pushing of American trade relations with the Near East, and to what good purpose.



THE "LEVANT HOUSE" MOVEMENT

(*"The Orient"*, December 10, 1919)

At the suggestion of Mr. Ravndal, American Commissioner and Consul General in Constantinople, and honorary President of the *American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant*, the latter organization has undertaken to organize a movement in the United States which, it is believed, will contribute materially towards bringing America and the Near East closer together in the bonds of commerce and culture. It is contemplated to crystallise this "rapprochement" in a LEVANT HOUSE to be founded in the metropolis of the United States along the lines of policy pursued in the establishment and maintenance of the "India House", one of the most historic Clubs in New York City.

The relations between the United States and the countries whose shores are washed by the Eastern Mediterranean and the Black Sea date back to the earliest days of American history. Records exist of a visit on the part of the S. S. "Mayflower" to Alexandretta in the 17th century, i.e. a long time before American independence was achieved. American merchants had dealings with the Levant during the Colonial period, and "Levant House" historians will herein find material for fascinating chronicles. In the days of George Washington, the grandfather of Mr. J. D. Langdon, an esteemed American business man in Smyrna of the present day, appeared in these waters and became one of the pioneers of the Boston-Smyrna trade. During 1810 twenty American vessels were to be seen lying in the Smyrna harbor. In 1819 the first American missionaries arrived in these parts, inaugurating the great philanthropic work which stands to America's everlasting credit in the Near East. 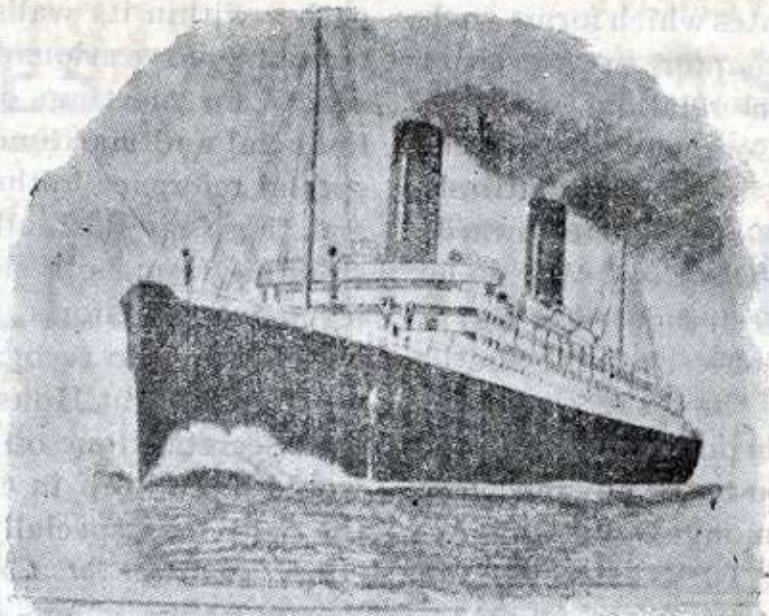

nal enterprises in the Levant were rendered possible by the defeat of the Barbary pirates which forms such a picturesque chapter in American annals. American relations with the British Levant Company present features of interest, so also the attitude of the Ottoman Government towards America during the Civil War. The important services rendered to Egypt by American ex-officers of the Southern confederacy have received but scant attention in public print. America's contribution to the advancement of civilization among Egyptians, Arabs, Armenians, Turks, Greeks, and Bulgarians deserves to be commemorated. This task of bringing into the light of day the connections between America and the Near East in the early days would be assumed by the proposed Levant House in New York. Literary research and lectures upon this topic would be actively encouraged.

The Levant House, besides cultivating traditions of this sort, would gather within its walls for social intercourse, for various kinds of conferences, for meetings on commercial, financial and maritime subjects with special reference to the United States and the Near East, all men of good standing from both sides whose achievements or efforts would seem to entitle them to recognition.

In the Levant House there would be a Secretary one of whose duties it would be to keep in close touch with the field and especially with the *American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant* whose agent in America he would be. As such he would furnish reports for publication in *THE ORIENT* and in the *Levant Trade Review* on American financial and commodity markets and otherwise act as an intermediary between East and West.

In order to carry out this Levant House idea whose realization is cal-

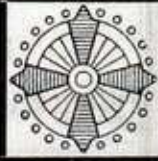
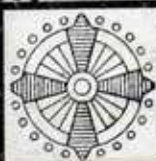

Opportunities for American Trade in the Near East.

Address of Lewis Heck, American Consular Service, Washington, Vice-President of the *American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant*, before the *American Manufacturers Export Association*, New York, October 16, 1919.

Before the war there was no other region of equal extent anywhere in which the American business world in general, and especially exporters, displayed so little direct interest as in the Near East or Levant, these two terms being used to designate the region covered by the countries surrounding the eastern Mediterranean, Aegean and Black Seas, from Egypt to Serbia, and from Greece to Persia. In other than commercial lines there has been for considerably more than half a century a wide and varied range of American activities in many of these countries, but it has been devoted almost exclusively to missionary, educational, and philanthropic enterprises and institutions.

The fact that American undertakings of this nature were not combined with equally energetic attempts to gain political advantages in that part of the world was long looked upon with suspicion by the various European nations and by the local population, who asked what America could possibly want, and what she could have as her ulterior motive in spending such large sums of money without apparently trying to obtain anything material in return. The answer to these questionings has at last been made clear to the peoples of Europe and the Near East, who now perceive from our attitude during and since the war that we have no hidden selfish motives; that we have at heart been animated with a desire to help rather than to acquire; and that all we ask is to have a fair chance to carry on our normal and ordinary activities as a great exporting nation under equal terms and in peaceful conditions.

Nowhere has the general recognition of this attitude of the United States been more general, and more genuinely convinced, than in the Near East. America is today a word to conjure with throughout Turkey and in many other regions. Upon the well laid foundations of American educational and philanthropic efforts has been built up a structure of faith in the benevolent intentions of America and of Americans: of confidence in our dealings and integrity; and of an intense desire to benefit from the moral prestige and commercial and financial strength of the United States.

Any European power would be ready and eager to make

serious sacrifices in order to have produced among the peoples of the Near East a like confidence and trust in it, and would waste no time in deriving all possible advantages from such a favorable attitude, but so far we have done almost nothing to profit from the very real opportunity that thus presents itself.

In addition to the many thousands of men and women who have been educated in American schools and colleges in the Near East, and the more numerous thousands who have been aided directly or indirectly by American philanthropy and charity in times of direst need, we must also take into account the hundreds of thousands of emigrants from the Near East who have come to this country and found a home and achieved prosperity. The ties thus formed should not be overlooked in any survey of the possibilities of the Levant for the American business man. My own experience has been that to no other peoples does America and their connection with America mean more than to the Greeks, Armenians, and Syrians who have come to this country—perhaps because of the great contrast between what they left behind in some of their old homes and what America had to offer them.

It is because America has so real and favorable a significance to the peoples of the Near East that we have heard so much of their desire for an American mandate, or for some sort of American aid and control. Besides our manifest freedom from any selfish territorial ambitions, they recognize that we could and would do more for them than any other great power, and trust in us to stand by the terms of our contract, especially as to withdrawal after a fixed period. Their conviction that their own selfish interests—for, after all, that is what they are looking to—would best be served by American aid and control is no small compliment to us.

Before the war United States bought from the Near East some fifty million dollars worth of goods, principally raw materials such as cotton from Egypt; tobacco, wool, mohair, skins, opium, rose oil, licorice root, dried fruits and nuts, etc, from Turkey; skins and coffee from Aden, dried fruits, cheese, olive oil and tobacco from Greece; copper and plum jam from Serbia; rose oil and tobacco from Bulgaria; reclaimed rubber and wool from Odessa; licorice root, wool, manganese, and hardwoods from Batoum. The manufactured goods consisted of carpets and rugs, laces, and curios, etc, and represented only a small proportion of the total. In general, the region we are considering is agricultural and pastoral rather than industrial, and there is but relatively slight industrial development in any of these countries, so that for many years to come they will have to import

manufactured and finished merchandise and will not have much in these lines to offer for sale in other countries. Their climates and soils enable them to produce better than elsewhere certain staple articles for which there will always be a demand in western Europe and the United States, and they will have their natural products to offer in exchange for their importations of finished commodities, until such future time as their own domestic industries shall come to a greater degree of production and variety.

For this reason the countries of the Near East offer a permanent field for the sale of the products of industry and manufacture, the value of which has always been fully recognized by our main competitors in Europe, although we have often overlooked it because of its distance and of relatively larger markets elsewhere. Nevertheless, a portion of the world which annually imported some \$550,000,000 worth of foreign goods before the war is worthy of closer study now that our exporters have waked up and are both ready and eager to really go after a fair share of this trade, instead of waiting till some small share of it comes to them of its own accord.

On the export side, we sold to all the Near East, including southern Russia, goods to a value of between ten and twelve million dollars per annum before the war. A large proportion of this total consisted of mineral, animal and vegetable oils; textiles played a smaller and decreasing part, as we had had to give way to more active British and Italian competition. We had some small business in leather and hides, shoes, rubber overshoes, typewriters and supplies, agricultural machinery, the better grades of tools, and certain American specialties, but in the principal staples which form the bulk of any real volume of trade we had almost no share, in spite of the fact that for the exports of Turkey we were the second best customer next after Great Britain, and also bought the second largest share of Egypt's principal crop. The heavy trade balance against us was paid for by remittances from immigrants to their home folks; by sums expended for American schools, missions, and colleges, etc; by tourists' expenditures, for many thousands of them annually visited Egypt, Palestine and Constantinople; and by financial adjustments through European countries. These remittances and expenses of course increased our debt to the Near East, but hereafter we should be able to exchange an increasingly larger volume of our own products for the goods we buy.

The American flag was almost never seen, except on occasional war vessels or yachts, or, for a time, on a locally owned line of small steamers which were no credit to the flag. There were no American

banking or credit agencies; no permanent American newspaper correspondents; and no central organization or Chamber of Commerce until 1911, when principally through the initiative and efforts of our present Consul General at Constantinople, Mr. G. B. Ravndal, the American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant was started on its successful career, its membership today being well over 600 firms and individuals, the greater part of whom are located in the commercial centers of the Levant.

During the war, and even before we came into it, all business transactions with Turkey and most of the Balkan Peninsula were at a standstill, unless we count the sale by the American Embassy at Constantinople of dollar exchange to an amount of more than ten million dollars to provide funds for relief and charitable payments of all sorts. Of this sum, several million dollars were furnished by the Entente Governments whose interests in Turkey were being looked after by American diplomatic and consular representatives; several million dollars were covered by funds deposited with the State Department for payment to individual beneficiaries in Turkey; the balance represented the funds of relief organizations such as the American and Syrian Relief Committee, the Joint Distribution Committee of the Jewish charitable organizations, etc. etc. The sale of this volume of dollar exchange did much to accustom local merchants and bankers to closer dealings with the United States and also helped to establish credits in this country which have been and are being used to purchase American goods.

Egypt and Greece were the only two countries in our field which were enabled during the war to maintain and develop their trade relations with the United States. Both have prospered in many ways since 1914, so that today the Greek currency is almost at par, better than that of any other country on the Entente side, and higher than for most of the neutral countries of Europe. The situation of Egypt is likewise strong, although somewhat affected by the agitations of last winter and wide spread labor troubles.

Exports from this country to Greece jumped from \$1,123,511 in 1913-14 to \$23,449,975 in 1914-15, and to slightly over \$ 31,000,000 in 1915-16. There are few countries which show a like increase during the war. In the fiscal year ending June 30, 1914, we shipped to Egypt goods to an amount of \$1,930,106. In 1916-1917 our total exports to Egypt were \$11,933,166. These two countries bought from us in 1916-17 more than three times as much as the entire Near Eastern field in 1913-1914.

With Greece we have special ties, there being more Greeks in

the United States today than in any other country foreign to Greece except Turkey. In Egypt we have the advantage of being a large purchaser of cotton, Egypt's most important product, and for political reasons Americans have been and still are very popular. Germany was beginning just before the war to acquire a large portion of Egypt's import trade, while we were still neglecting that market. With the increased prosperity and purchasing power of the country combined with a higher standard of living and a sound credit situation, there is no reason why the United States cannot continue to have a larger share in Egypt's trade, always making allowance for the fact that Britain's policy towards her trade rivals in Egypt will probably not be so liberal as it was before the war.

These two countries having thus been in close contact with American export trade in recent years, we shall not go into further details in regard to their markets, but will rather examine the countries with which we had almost no commercial intercourse during the war. Turkey, or the Ottoman Empire, is perhaps the country which holds out to us the most interesting possibilities, because of its uncertain and problematical future; its present state of complete liquidation based on the rooting up during the war of Entente trade connections, and the expulsion of all Germans and Austrians since the armistice, making the present a period for the formation of new connections and establishment of trade relations on a new basis; because of its great potential wealth and resources, making it the largest undeveloped area of such wealth within easy reach of Europe; and because of its present friendly and cordial attitude towards America and American goods.

For the few years before the war we bought from Turkey about \$22,000,000 worth of goods each year, of which tobacco represented about half of the total. We sold, on the other hand, not more than an average of \$3,500,000 per annum. The principal American establishments in Turkey were educational and missionary. Next to the French, whose religious orders have been engaged in missionary and educational activities in Turkey since the days of Louis XIV and longer, there were more American schools, missions and colleges than of any other nationality, ours outnumbering all the others put together except the French. We also have the most prominent and conspicuous colleges, such as the University at Beirut, Robert College and the Girls College at Constantinople, the International College at Smyrna, and several large and admirably conducted institutions in Egypt. In almost every city of importance in Asia Minor and Syria the traveler who approached it was likely

to see a large and well constructed group of buildings, standing out among the rest of the city, and upon inquiry he would be told that these buildings belonged to the Americans. Hospital and medical activities were among the main features of missionary work, and were badly needed in a country where extreme ignorance prevailed and doctors were few and unskilled. In more recent years other practical lines have been taken up, so that today Robert College has the first real school of engineering in Turkey, and plans are ready for agricultural courses for both Robert College and the University at Beirut as soon as conditions permit their execution.

Besides the schools and colleges, we had the buying agencies of the various American tobacco companies and the MacAndrews & Forbes Co; the selling and production agencies of the Standard Oil Co. of New York and the Vacuum Oil Co.; and the omnipresent and widely extended organization of the Singer Sewing Machine Co. Beyond these principal concerns there were very few that were distinctly American in character. There would be occasional visits from American business men who happened to go to Turkey; or, on one special occasion in recent years, there was the attempt to obtain a concession for a 1200 mile railway known as the Chester project, which was designed to open up valuable mineral regions, and for which a total investment of \$100,000,000 was planned. This scheme was defeated in 1911 after a hard fight, principally by German opposition, but the need for such a road still exists, and had it been constructed before the war, the strategic position of Turkey against the Russian armies in the Caucasus would have been vastly stronger.

Last winter after the signing of the armistice and the subsequent lifting of the blockade against Turkey in February, the United States was the first country to do a large business at Constantinople. American flour was at once put on the market and brought the cost of bread down to forty per cent. of what it had been, besides vastly improving the quality. American flour was displayed in all the grocery shops of the city, American flags being stuck in each sack with the reduced price prominently marked. Can you imagine a better form of advertisement for America in a hungry and war-starved city? The same thing was done with condensed milk, and America got full credit of having broken the hold of the food speculators and profiteers, with whom Constantinople was probably more generously supplied than any city any where. Yet, in order to carry out the distribution of these American goods sent in by Mr. Hoover's administration, we had to have recourse to a

British firm and a British bank, as there were no American concerns which could handle the proposition.

Then came the arrival of some 350 workers belonging to the American Committee for Relief in the Near East, with which you are doubtless familiar, and which most of you have probably helped to carry on its wonderful work. This sent American stock up a few notches higher. Finally, in recent weeks the American section of the international mandate commission under Charles R. Crane and Dr. Henry King, of Oberlin College, came to Constantinople, and gave the various races and religions a full chance to state their national hopes and aspirations—still another factor in favor of the high opinion of America's fairness and impartiality, and her desire to secure a just and permanent settlement of the vexed problems of the Near East.

Side by side with these activities, ordinary trade has grown up on a much larger scale than ever before. The American ships which brought the flour to Constantinople, Bulgaria, and Roumania were available for taking back large quantities of Turkish goods that were awaiting shipment. In a couple of months more than ten million dollars worth of goods were thus shipped, in some cases none too wisely, for tobacco and opium soon were largely overstocked in this country. Many of these shipments were made by new firms which had never dealt with this country and were consigned to banks. But in almost every instance the proceeds were intended to be used for the purchase of American goods.

Today we have frequent and regular direct steamers, something we have never had in the past in the Near East. The food administration ships showed the American flag in a few months more often than it had been seen on American merchant vessels in the past 30 years. Now you can see in the shipping lists in this city that three or four vessels are leaving each month for Constantinople and other Levant ports. Before the war we had to depend almost entirely upon shipments broken at English, French, German, Italian, or Austrian ports, usually with long delays and hard treatment of the goods shipped, especially of such articles as cotton seed oil. With direct shipping and American banks in the Near East, combined with the new spirit and vision of the American exporter, there is no reason why in the future we cannot gain and hold an export trade approximating what we buy from the Levant.

In recent months exports to Turkey have been almost entirely staple articles for immediate consumption, combined with a few special lines such as automobiles, trucks, etc. The time has not yet

come to stock up on a large scale in the goods that will be needed when there is a resumption of normal life throughout the country and the question of domestic transportation can again be met. But now is the time to make preparations for the greater demand and volume of trade that will follow the restoration of peace conditions in Turkey. That this fact is appreciated is shown by the gratifying number of large American houses which have sent or are sending their own representatives to the Levant, and also by the much larger numbers of British, French, and Italian, and even Japanese business men who have gone there in recent months. A Japanese delegation of thirty members was recently at Constantinople, and Japanese cotton goods were the first to be imported last March.

As Turkey offers today the largest unsatisfied market in the Near East we shall give a few details concerning the plans of our competitors towards gaining and holding the trade of the country. Until peace with Turkey is signed no Germans or Austrians can return there, so that for the immediate present they need not be taken into consideration, but we must not allow ourselves to believe that the Germans, who had devoted so much of their energy towards acquiring first place in Turkey, will allow themselves to be easily ousted, even although the terms of the armistice have been a hard blow to their plans. Their banks are closed, their railways under other control, and their nationals expelled from the country, but their business interests still have strong roots there which will form a strong basis for future operations.

The nucleus around which center new British plans to expand their interests in Turkey is the British Trade Corporation and its subsidiaries, notably the Levant Co., Ltd., a revival of the old name. This concern has acquired a controlling interest in the largest British trading house in Turkey, in the only British bank, and is closely affiliated with several of the larger native firms. It plans a wide extension of its business activities beyond purely commercial lines, and expects to have a hand in the development of the mineral and other resources of the country. Another large British syndicate including several established British firms in Constantinople has been formed and also has some American connections. The head of the Levant Co. has been back at Constantinople since December, and he as well as other British firms have the advantage of the long-established trade and banking connections with Great Britain, and of all the machinery of world trade which the United States has not yet developed in many foreign countries.

The development of the oil fields of Mesopotamia will be almost

entirely in British hands if present plans go through without modification. These fields, combined with those of Persia and probably of Arabia, will be among the richest in the world, and only a few weeks ago a British financier predicted that within a short time the greater portion of the world's production of oil would be under British control.

The French have also long-established connections and large investments in Turkey, especially in the debt of the government and railways, public works, etc. Their general commerce was not in a very flourishing condition just before the war, but they have plans for the extension of their trade with Turkey, and a large French mission, including the head of one of the national export associations of France, recently visited the important trade centers of the Near East. There has also been an attempt to secure a monopoly for France of all mineral development in Turkey, in exchange for a loan to the Turkish Government.

The Italians and Greeks have the advantages of numbers and close proximity. The former have also, for the moment at least, fallen heir to most of the Austrian connections with the Levant, especially in banking and shipping. The steamers of the Austrian Lloyd Company, which had the largest fleet and the best managed vessels in Near Eastern waters, today fly the Italian flag, and are already running on most of their old schedules, this company having lost very few ships during the war. As to the Greeks, their country does not have many industrial products to export, and their activities are principally as traders and dealers in goods imported from other countries.

I am convinced that the American man who wants to enter this field can get a fair share of business, if he goes about the task with the same energy and methods he would employ in entering a new field in the United States. However, he must not think that he has an easy proposition before him, for in normal times the Levant is one of the hardest markets in which to do business. Fortunately the present situation because of its unsettled and rapidly changing character offers him an exceptional chance just at the time when he is more anxious than ever before to avail himself of it, and when he is in a position to successfully meet European competition as to prices. Just recently a large British firm at Constantinople placed in New York a substantial order for American cotton goods which never would have come to this country in other circumstances.

Now that we have direct and frequent shipping facilities, an Amer-

ican bank in Constantinople and the other main centers is the next most important step in building up the machinery of our trade with the Levant. For the purely financial operations of our trade there already exist sufficient banking facilities of sorts, but what we need is something that will help the credit situation; tend to give the American exporter the feeling that he can deal with a distinctly American institution in which he can have full confidence; emancipate our trade from the necessity of having to depend for our banking facilities upon banks which are nearly all owned by our principal commercial rivals, whose interests they will serve first of all; and also project into that market a bit of the system and integrity of high-class American business life. This will benefit us and improve our position. At the same time, we shall have a better chance to learn that all business men in the Near East are not rascals, but that there is probably as high an average of business morality and reliability there as elsewhere. Remember that in the past most of our trade with this part of the world has been carried on by correspondence, and that at a great distance a rascal can always write a more plausible and convincing letter than an honest man who limits himself to facts.

Another important feature of an American banking house would be to provide a basis for investment in the development of Turkish resources, after some sort of a stable governmental regime is established. While Asia Minor has been called a "region rich in poor mines", there is undoubted mineral wealth—oil, copper, coal and iron, lead, zinc, antimony, chrome, borax, emery, alum, etc. etc. which has not been generally explored or scientifically tested in the past.

But for the next decade or two Turkey will remain primarily an agricultural and pastoral country, and in the development of its agricultural production and prosperity American exporters and investors can play a considerable role. Irrigation projects on a large scale will have to be carried out; agricultural machinery, tractors, and motor transportation will be required until more railways can be built; hydro-electric development will be possible in almost all parts of Asia Minor, with its high altitudes and numerous streams; new crops such as sugar beets can be easily introduced, and with a better economic situation for its agricultural population, forming the great majority, the purchasing power of the country for other lines of trade will be increased. Today not more than twenty per cent of Turkish agricultural products are touched by any but the most primitive tools and methods, native to the country.

Besides mineral and agricultural opportunities for development

transportation and public works offer many possibilities for the introduction of American goods, especially if they can be aided by American capital under an American mandate or any other reasonably good government. In 1914 all Turkey, with a population of about twenty million and an area of 695,000 square miles, more than fifteen times the area of Pennsylvania, had less than five thousand miles of railway, and only three cities had electric light plants or electric street railways. Constantinople itself did not possess telephones, electric street cars or lights until 1913-14. From the point of view of modern industrial development the country is almost virgin soil. In 1914 there was less than one automobile to each 200,000 inhabitants.

Although there has been some relief in the past six months, the cost of living at Constantinople is still higher than in almost any city in Europe outside of Russia. According to figures issued each month by the Ottoman Public Debt administration, under foreign control, in January, 1919, the cost of certain staple and necessary articles forming the ordinary requirements of a small family had increased 21 times over what it was in June 1914. But with this difficult situation there is as yet no question of labor troubles. They may come later, when there is more of a revival of business and more numerous ways to earn a living. Today the struggle is too keen and the supply of labor too great for the few jobs to be had.

The question of credits in Turkey is fundamentally affected by the uncertainty of the political future. The Turkish debt, in round figures, reckoning the Turkish pound at its normal par value, is nearly \$2,000,000,000, and today the total revenue of the government is not enough to pay the interest on this debt, without taking into account the ordinary budgetary expenses. Nevertheless, even with this situation the future is by no means helpless or hopeless, if a logical and careful fiscal plan covering a long period of years is adopted, and a fair distribution of the debt of the Empire is made among the component parts which will be detached from it. However bad things are today, the Turkish paper money is worth more in exchange than any other paper currency of the former central powers, and is slightly better than that of such countries as Poland, Czecho-Slovakia, Jugoslavia, and Roumania.

If I have seemed to show too much enthusiasm for the future and possibilities of Turkey, I want to add that, given reasonably good administration and government, security of person and property, and a benevolent rather than a selfish regime, the former territories of the Ottoman Empire will realize all and more than

I have tried to indicate. Anything will be better than the recent past in Turkey, and even if that unhappy country should not, for reasons that cannot be overcome, realize the full and ideal measure of its possibilities of development, it will still offer a large and favorable field quite worth while entering and holding.

In Bulgaria, as in Turkey, there are special reasons why America should be popular. I do not allude to our not having declared war on that country, but rather to the effect upon its growth and progress of the education afforded Bulgarian students at Robert College, where for many years they formed the largest of all racial elements. There has also been a considerable emigration from Bulgaria to the United States, numbering some 75,000, and the majority of these emigrants have returned in the course of time to their homes.

Bulgaria is not a rich country and does not possess great natural resources, but it has a steady and sound business life, and as it is primarily agricultural and pastoral it will need for years to come to import manufactured goods. Trade customs are, however, different in Bulgaria, and there most transactions will have to be carried on by firms native to the country. There is also a strong tendency to protect and foster such local industries as exist, and in the future this attitude will have to be reckoned with. For the present, Bulgaria has taken off almost all restrictions on her foreign trade, which is now principally hampered by her critical financial situation. With an indemnity of some \$450,000,000 to pay and a national debt, in addition, of about \$1,680,000,000 (nominal value), the country has to meet a very heavy burden. Even before the war, the paper currency of Bulgaria was at a discount, and today its situation is far worse. The Bulgarians have, however, a tenacity of purpose and a genius for hard work that will aid them in their difficulties, and it must also be remembered that their country was not invaded during the war and suffered no special hardships from lack of food.

Serbia, or rather the Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes, otherwise known as Jugoslavia, is in need of most sorts of manufactured and finished articles, and is favorably disposed to the United States and grateful for our aid in the war. While this country will not have to pay an indemnity, the task before it will not be an easy one, and it is to be hoped that conditions in the Balkans may be sufficiently tranquil to permit these war-stricken countries to devote the greater part of their national energy to reconstruction rather than to aggression or self-defense. Of immediate interest is

the estimated surplus of cereal production this year in Jugoslavia, which should provide some 800,000 to 1,000,000 tons of grain for export. Our trade with pre-war Serbia was small, but if some way can be found to extend credit, our exports to the new country should be large enough to make it an attractive field. Besides the channel through Salonica and by the Danube, which holds out possibilities of great development, so that Belgrade may become one of the principal interior ports of central Europe, the new kingdom will also have an outlet to the Adriatic, and it is possible that in the future much of its foreign trade will follow this new route.

Roumania has a great future before her. She comes out of the war with a population more than doubled (now about 15,000,000) and has acquired in her new territories new sources of wealth to add to her pre-war agricultural prosperity and oil fields. She will have about the same area as Italy, and besides wheat and petroleum she now possesses much larger areas of forests, some coal, iron and copper, etc. Even with the disturbed and exhausted state of the country it was recently estimated that without taking Bessarabia into account Roumania would this year have a surplus of wheat and corn for export amounting to about 500,000 tons. Her oil industry is slowly coming back to normal, which means that with peaceful conditions and good terms with her neighbors she will soon be prosperous again.

Roumania is the only country in our field to which we used to sell more than we bought, the balance in our favor being about four to one. She offers a very favorable opportunity for the increase and expansion of our pre-war exports, but with all the other trade interests strongly entrenched there we shall have to work hard for all we get.

It is impossible to make any accurate statement about the present situation in southern Russia. Roumania controls Bessarabia, but to the eastward there is no settled regime except where General Denikine rules. The rest is in a chaotic state, with the Bolsheviki in control for a short time until replaced by some other faction, and so on. Odessa and Sevastopol were evacuated by the French at the beginning of last April, and since then no foreign troops have taken charge. There is, nevertheless, some trade even with Odessa and other ports, which is handled from Constantinople, and there are regular sailings from Constantinople to Novorossisk, Rostoff, Mariopol, Taganrog, etc., as well as to Batoum. British ex-

ports to southern Russia increased from £344,000 in April last to £808,000 in July.

There would be a very large demand for all sorts of foodstuffs, textiles, clothing and a wide range of manufactured goods if the question of payment could but be settled, for at Batoum with the Allies in control, and where there is a surplus of certain native wares for export, in July a dollar was worth 60 rubles. The Kuban district under General Denikine has had some wool, tobacco, and cereals to export, but transportation and barter are very difficult. The trade of this region of Russia must take the form of barter, and to the exporter who wants to try for a share of it during the next few years, until the region shall have become more settled, Constantinople presents the best base of operations.

In normal times at this season of the year there used to be a steady and unbroken succession of grain laden vessels passing down the Bosphorus on their way to England and western Europe. Constantinople also drew a large share of its sugar alcohol, and other imports from southern Russia, which had a great variety of natural products. Under the present conditions prevailing there the Caucasus is the only region that has any considerable amount of goods for export, and there is no way of telling when the country will be sufficiently reorganized to permit a resumption of useful productive activities.

One of the striking developments of Russia in recent years is the wide extension of cooperative societies, which handle both the produce of the peasants and villagers, and at the same time carry in stock and distribute all sorts of supplies needed by the country population. These cooperative societies will probably form one of the main factors in the foundation for any resumption of trade on a large scale.

What has been said of the natural resources of Turkey applies in large measure to the Trans-Caucasus, where there are now three small republics of Georgia, Armenia, and Azerbaidjan. This region is almost certain to come under some sort of mandatory regime, as it presents the same problems of racial conflict as Turkey, and needs a strong hand to keep the various factions in order and peace. Here also there are great natural resources, especially minerals. In 1913 the Caucasus produced over a million tons of manganese, of which 121,887 tons were sent to the United States. Other mineral products were copper, cement, salt, coal, and carbonate of potash. In 1901 Russia produced slightly more oil than the United

States; in 1913 its output was 15% less than in 1901, and less than one-third as much as the production of the United States.

Tobacco and licorice root, and valuable hardwoods, such as the Circassian walnut, also come to the United States from this region. In order that licorice might not be lacking for American candy and chewing tobacco, when the supply of root from Turkey was cut off by the blockade, shipments of licorice root had to be made from the Caucasus across Russia, Siberia, the Pacific and the United States at a freight cost of many times the original value, which is low, as the root grows wild. A shipment of Circassian walnut logs bound to Baltimore happened to be caught on a German vessel at Constantinople in 1914 and was later unloaded. We could never trace it afterwards, and there is every reason to fear that it was used for firewood or a similarly lowly purpose.

There has been some resumption of trade with the Caucasus, the American relief committees having sent in foodstuffs and supplies, and British firms having shipped several cargoes of general merchandise to a value of more than \$6,000,000. There has also been talk of an Anglo-Armenian bank and a British project to develop hydro-electric plants in the Caucasus, but now that the British troops have been withdrawn from that region, it is not likely that these plans can be carried out for a long time.

To show how the local possibilities of these regions can be developed under a helpful regime, we can cite the case of the cotton industry of Turkestan and also the cotton seed oil production there which was beginning to seriously compete with American cotton oil at Constantinople just before the war. The mills belonged in part to the Russian royal family, and the oil, of a very good quality, could be brought directly to Odessa or other Black Sea ports in tank cars.

The restoration of the industries and agriculture of southern Russia will have to come soon or late, as it is too rich a region and has too active a population to remain permanently in its present state. When better days do come, there will be a tremendous market for the exporting nations which take the right steps to gain it; which have their own representatives at Constantinople or elsewhere within easy reach; which will helpfully cooperate with the orderly elements that will in time come into power; and which through their direct contact and complete knowledge of the situation will be able to judge how far they can safely go in extending credit and financial support.

Our exports to Persia in the past have been almost infinitesimal, amounting to only a few thousand dollars per annum, but of late years relations have been closer, and the Shah last year purchased several hundred thousand dollars worth of Liberty bonds. The total pre-war import trade of Persia amounted to about 40 million dollars. During the war the main channel for reaching Persia was through Mesopotamia, but when stable conditions are again established in the Caucasus it is probable that Batoum will again become one of the main entry and transit ports for European goods going to northern Persia.

To sum up, the Near East is a region which today is, with the exception of one or two countries, badly demoralized, but which has strong underlying elements of health and vigor, and presents by no means a hopeless case. As a field for the sale of manufactured articles its value is fully recognized by our European competitors, who are sparing no pains to consolidate their positions and establish their claims. It is a field in which America and Americans are respected and welcomed. We have a very real advantage and a very real opportunity if we will, but it is a field for the permanent future rather than for immediate trade in large volume, due entirely to the war, such as we now enjoy in some parts of the world. It will not come to us easily but we must make real efforts to win it now and to keep it in the years to come.

Through a strange working out of the guiding destiny of this world it seems particularly appropriate that the United States should have a prominent and helpful part in the rehabilitation of this historic region. The discovery of the American continent was one of the principal causes contributing to the decline of the trade routes from Europe to the East via Turkey and Egypt; to the eclipse of Constantinople, of the Italian maritime republics, and of the trade of the eastern Mediterranean. Now it seems more than likely that America, American business men, American capital, will be among the principal causes contributing to the economic restoration and development of the Near East.

TRANS-BALKANIC RAILWAY

(*"The Times", London.*)

An important undertaking, which has been practically overlooked in this country, will be consummated with the completion of a new railroad to run from Valona, on the Adriatic, to Monastir. The fulfilment of this scheme will not only benefit greatly the undeveloped country of Albania, but will give Italy through communications across the Balkans with Constantinople.

The success of the scheme is insured by the fact that it has been approved by a committee upon which such well-known banking establishments as the Credito Italiana, and the Compagnia Italo-Britannica are represented.

Obviously the scheme is of the greatest interest to Italy, who hither-

to has been greatly handicapped in her competition with Austria for the trade of the Balkans. A glance at the map will show what an enormous advantage it will be to the trade of the Adriatic. The efficiency of the railway will be further increased by two ferries which will carry the train over the Otranto Canal. Thus the Italian system will be linked up with the new railway.

Although the principal object of the railway is the establishment of a more direct route from the Adriatic to Constantinople, the scheme is bound to react beneficially on the development of Albania, where commercial progress has been greatly retarded by the lack of railway communications and good roads. At present the resources of the country have been practically untouched, but it is believed to be very rich in minerals. It is known that there are extensive deposits of coal capable of

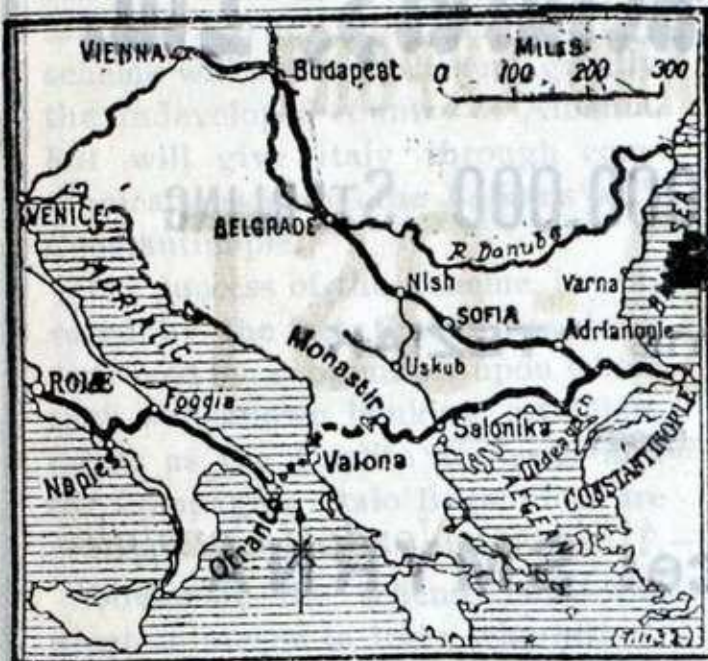

being worked. The country is rich in timber, and there is good pasture land. On the other hand, there are many marshes which should be converted into fertile soil. The construction of the railway would lead to the proper drainage of the country.

The Albanian towns through which

the railroad will pass will benefit greatly. The starting point, Valona, will become the principal port of the country. Thirty seven kilometres from Valona is Fieri, the centre of the fertile plain of Muzekeja, the granary of Albania. The railroad should mean a great growth in the development of this town as a market place for the export of cereals, cattle and fish. Other places which should benefit by the scheme, although not at present touching the route, are the cities of Berat, Elbassan, and Corcia. It is hoped to link up these cities by branch lines with stations of the same name on the Trans-Balkanic Railway.

Near Corcia is the Lake of Malik, a vast marsh formed by the lateral extension of the River Devoil. It is hoped to effect the drainage of this lake

by straightening out the course of the river; thus the curse of malaria will be removed and the country will gain a very fertile belt of land.

It is also proposed to link up Durazzo, the most important port of Albania, by a branch which will run in an almost straight line through the plain of Kavaja along the old Roman road, called the Via Egnatia which is still in use. After diverging from this road and taking the Musekeja road, it will join the Trans-Balkanic not far from Pekini, at a suitable point between Fieri and Berat. Not only will this junction contribute immensely to the internal well-being of the country, by the exploitation of the immense natural wealth of the country, the development of the traffic, and the exchange of products, but it will form an intimate intellectual and moral union with the Western world.

As the country is at present in an exceedingly unsettled state, it is not proposed to use electric traction at the outset. Moreover, there are considerable deposits of lignite which could be used as fuel for the locomotives. If, however, in the future

it should be considered desirable to use electric power, it is believed that the water stored in the Lakes Prysapa and Okhrida would offer excellent means of power-generation.

Tourists may go to Europe.

Passports will be issued on and after October first to tourists going to France, Belgium, Spain, Portugal, Italy and Northern Africa, except Egypt. Applications may be sent in before September fifteen, but passports will not be sent out before that date. The State Department announcement added:

"As the trans-Atlantic passenger service has not yet reached its normal condition, and as many Americans now in Europe are unable to obtain passage to this country in the near future because of the crowding of steamers, it is advisable for those who propose to go to European countries to obtain assurances in advance from steamship companies that they will be able to secure return passage to this country."

Entraves Commerciales dans le Levant.

On écrit de Constantinople au «Times», à Londres:

“Les importateurs de marchandises anglaises à Constantinople et les agents des compagnies maritimes anglaises ont tenu le 5 Novembre à la Chambre de Commerce Anglaise une réunion et pris les résolutions suivantes qui ont été soumises au Haut Commissaire Britannique.

(1). S. E. le Haut Commissaire Britannique est prié de demander aux Autorités Françaises et Anglaises l'évacuation des Douanes de Galata et de Stamboul, et d'obliger les autorités Ottomanes à leur procurer assez d'entrepôts à la Douane pour emmagasiner les marchandises en circulation.

(2). Les autorités Ottomanes ne pouvant effectuer avec succès la police du port et des quais de Constantinople les autorités alliées sont priées de le faire elles-mêmes.

(3). Les maisons de commerce ayant obtenu des licences des Douanes Ottomanes pour la construction de dépôts transitaires privés soient autorisées par la Compagnie des Quais à les construire.

Dans une lettre adressée au Commandant en chef de l'armée de la Mer Noire les signataires de la résolution ci-dessus attirent son attention sur ce fait que l'occupation par les autorités militaires Britanniques des deux tiers des Douanes de Galata constitue un sérieux obstacle au commerce et en particulier au commerce Britannique.

La lettre continue ainsi: avant la guerre, la Chambre de Commerce Britannique de concert avec les autorités Britanniques, voulaient que le Gouvernement Ottoman et la compagnie des Quais fournissent des entrepôts sous garantie pour améliorer la Douane et les dépôts de transit de Constantinople, mais, par suite des obstacles "caractéristiques de l'administration Ottomane" cette tentative a eu peu de succès. La Chambre des Agents Maritimes a souvent durant ces quelques derniers mois approché sans nul succès les autorités Militaires Alliées au sujet de l'occupation par les militaires alliés en général et Britanniques en particulier d'une si grande partie de la Douane de Galata et d'une partie relativement limitée de celle de Stamboul. Sans doute les autorités Ottomanes s'amuse à regarder l'action des autorités Alliées (et des autorités Britanniques en particulier) au sujet de leurs Douanes.

La lettre nous montre encore que, à cause de la congestion du port, les frais de débarquement des marchandises arrivant dans le port de Constantinople s'élèvent à plus de la moitié du prix de transport de ces marchandises de Liverpool ou de Londres. Le débarquement de ces marchandises du navire jusqu'aux entrepôts du commerçant prend invariablement plus de temps que le transport maritime de ces marchandises de Liverpool à Constantinople. En sus, le règlement militaire défendant aux chalands (autres que ceux servant aux approvisionnements militaires) d'ancrer ou de décharger sur les quais devant les entrepôts occupés par les militaires, et défendant aux civils de passer sur le quai devant ces dits entrepôts est encore un obstacle au commerce.

Le Gouvernement Britannique s'efforce par la presse et les discours à encourager les fabricants et les commerçants britanniques à exporter autant que possible afin d'établir la balance dans le commerce et de faire baisser la cherté de la vie. Pourrions nous suggérer aux autorités Alliées militaires, et aux autorités Britanniques en particulier, d'aider dans cette tentative en faisant évacuer immédiatement les locaux des douanes de Galata et de Stamboul?

Au cours de la séance il a été également relevé que le nombre de chalands et de bouées avait diminué depuis le commencement de la guerre, ce nombre n'était

même pas suffisant alors. Les compagnies de navigation ont à manier deux ou trois fois plus de marchandises anglaises dans le port les unes pour la Turquie, les autres en transit pour la Russie du sud, sans mentionner la quantité considérable d'approvisionnements militaires pour les armées alliées d'occupation. Les importations seront donc arrêtées pour quelque temps faute d'espace à la Douane.

On espère que les autorités militaires profiteront de leurs pouvoirs de réquisition pour remédier à ce qui au point de vue commercial est une situation fort grave. On se demande si les autorités alliées se chargeront de la police du port. Le vol est à l'ordre du jour et est toléré par une partie de la police turque qui dit-on aide même à voler le charbon et les marchandises des chalands et fait feu sur ceux qui voudraient empêcher ces vols. La quantité de charbon appartenant au Gouvernement Britannique volé depuis l'armistice par ces bandes doit s'élever à une somme considérable, et les militaires eux-même souffrent de ces vols fréquents de vêtements et d'approvisionnement, qui ne cessent que pour recommencer. Mais la prévision d'un contingent de quelques centaines de police militaire et navale serait une charge considérable pour les troupes alliées; plusieurs personnes pensent que les Alliés recrutent une police locale, y nommant les officiers, et leur payent leur salaire tandis que leur gouvernement feraient payer les frais de maintien au gouvernement Ottoman."

L'article ci-dessus démontre la justesse de notre point de vue exposé dans l'article que nous avons écrit dernièrement au sujet du Port de Constantinople.

Toutes nos félicitations aux importateurs de marchandises anglaises et aussi aux Agents des Compagnies de Navigation Anglaises pour leurs résolutions. Il ne nous reste qu'à souhaiter vivement que les Autorités Militaires Anglaises et Françaises accueillent favorablement les très légitimes demandes du Commerce. Et alors même que depuis le 5 Novembre plus de six semaines se sont écoulées sans qu'un indice, sans qu'une décision de la part des dites Autorités soient pris, nous ne désespérons pas pour cela, d'ailleurs nous formons le vœux que la paix avec la Turquie ne tarde guère à survenir; elle amènera sans nul doute la paix au port de Constantinople aussi.

Depuis notre dernier exposé la situation n'a fait qu'empirer.

La Russie ne présente aucune sécurité aux chargeurs et d'autres parts le taux du change est désastreux.

Constantinople devient par la force des choses l'entrepôt des marchandises destinées à la Russie, les magasins de transit de la Société des Quais, ainsi que ceux des privés s'emplissent journellement de ces marchandises à un tel point que sous peu il n'y aura plus de place pour loger même la cargaison d'une mahonne. Force nous est donc d'attendre l'évacuation par les Autorités Militaires des Entrepôts qu'elles occupent.

Nous jugeons opportun d'attirer l'attention de qui de droit sur la question de l'arrimage des marchandises dans ces dépôts aussi-

tôt leur évacuation. Si ce soin est confié aux portefaix de la douane il s'ensuivra que les dépôts seront encombrés par une quantité de colis représentant moins du quart du nombre qu'ils peuvent réellement contenir tellement l'arrimage est mal fait! Une visite aux entrepôts douaniers de Stamboul ne peut que faire constater ce que nous signalons à ce sujet. Le désordre règne dans le dépôt du "*Dahlie*" et aussi dans ceux N° 5, 4, 2; et 1.— Le record toutefois du désordre est acquis par le dépôt N° 3 que l'on a réussi à occuper avec un fort petit nombre de colis par rapport à la quantité qu'il peut contenir—en les plaçant d'une manière vraiment difficile à concevoir et dont l'encombrement a été obtenu. Les auteurs de ce travail intelligent méritent des félicitations!! Pour se rendre compte de la façon dont l'arrimage doit être effectué on n'a qu'à visiter l'entrepôt situé près du pont cédé pour être exploité à une maison privée. Les colis y sont arrimés, suivant leur nature et marques avec grand soin et l'estivage est fait jusqu'au plafond. On y procède avec méthode et on parvient ainsi à faire le plus possible d'économie de place.

Nous nous permettons de recommander aux intéressés et notamment aux Agents des Compagnies de Navigation, d'étudier cette question d'arrimage des marchandises dans les dépôts; elle mérite une étude sérieuse, car d'un bon arrimage fait intelligemment dans les entrepôts à être évacués à bientôt espérons-nous pourra résulter le soulagement de l'encombremant existant actuellement dans notre port. Quant à la question "mahonnes et bouées" celle-ci fera l'objet d'une prochaine étude spéciale.

En ce qui concerne l'idée émise par notre confrère relativement à la création d'une police du port appelée à prévenir les vols très importants et si fréquents qui se commettent, nous l'éprouvons.

Nous estimons toutefois qu'une police navale, pour des raisons que nous ne pouvons pas détailler ici, ne conviendrait pas.

Nous sommes d'avis que des motor-boat rapides, en nombre suffisant, montés par des policiers à la tête desquels seraient placés des policiers anglais français ou italiens faisant la patrouille dans le port notamment pendant la nuit, donneraient des résultats satisfaisants.

Il est indispensable aussi que les mahonniers, ainsi que les gardiens de nuit des allées soient sous un contrôle sévère et soumis à un règlement rigoureux. Il en résultera une grande diminution de méfaits.

American Alcohol

Some time since there appeared in certain local newspapers articles dealing with commercial alcohol imported from the United States stating that the said alcohol was poisonous and had been seized and destroyed by the local authorities.

A full investigation of this matter has now been made and we are happy to be able to make reply to this scurrilous attack on an American commodity.

It seems that the containers in which this alcohol was shipped bore a label reading as follows :

"These spirits were produced from material fermented after September 9th, 1917. All persons are warned that their use in the manufacturing or preparation of beverages or their sale for beverage purposes will subject the persons so using or selling them to a fine of not exceeding \$ 5000

or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both."

It is true that this label may have been slightly misleading to one not familiar with the prohibition movement in the United States. But this movement has received so much publicity that it should have been apparent to all who read that the object of the label was merely to secure the free interstate shipment of this alcohol as commercial alcohol and to obviate the possibility of its confiscation in dry territory as an alcoholic beverage. There is absolutely nothing in the label to suggest that the alcohol is poisonous and that it is not has been shown by analyses undertaken by the local authorities.

All statements to the effect that local persons have been poisoned through imbibing this alcohol are therefore unfounded and should be considered merely a fact of a propaganda against an American product
